



## Rules for marking products with a production batch number

Since 1st of January 2026, the Pfeifer & Langen Group in Poland has implemented a modified batch labeling system for packaging. The change involves replacing the number 3 in the plant designation with the letter P. This change is due to the fact that this designation has been used since 2016, and this year, the number 6 reappears in the year designation R, which would lead to duplicate batch numbers in the SAP database.
